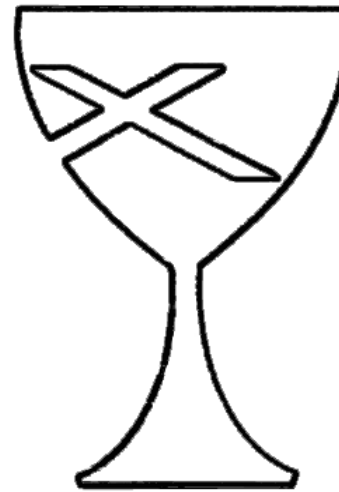

*Sent With Love To You!*



Easter is not far ahead. For a significant number of people Easter and Christmas may be the only times they attend church. In the past, churches and pastors have made a big deal of this, heaping on the guilt. One pastor actually said on Easter Sunday, "For those who haven't been here since last Easter or Christmas, if I

don't see you again until next Easter, I won't let you come in." I suspect God winced. Big Time! I was in the congregation, and I know I winced!

In the past, churches tended to base "success" on the numbers of people attending Sunday services, Bible Studies—events, in other words. Easter and Christmas were seen basically as major marketing opportunities. That tendency has been part of the problem as church numbers declined over the past half-century. The churches that have seemed to thrive during that time have been those striving, not for "success", but for obedience.

Dr. Brady Bryce was a pastor for 14 years before he joined the faculty at Abilene Christian University. "As churches, we tend to offer things at Easter that we think people want, like an egg hunt, a meal, or some kind of service activity," says Dr. Bryce. "But ... if **we are merely attracting people to fun, clever, intellectual, or entertaining experiences, then we have lost.** We don't want to draw people to events, we want to draw them to God" (emphasis mine). His words echo our Missional Purpose, which is "to passionately engage others with the love of Christ..."

**Dr. Bryce urges us to "avoid** making visitor/membership numbers the ultimate goal." Instead, he suggests we consider counting the number of people our church members *invite* to Easter service. Or count the number of people your church is actively *praying for* in the weeks leading up to Easter. "Change starts with us as followers of Christ," says Dr. Bryce. "This approach flips the script of what our churches value."

I would add that, while Jesus' parable of the banquet leaves no doubt that "attendance" is important, the scales are tilted in the direction of Jesus' many other sayings, including the "Great Commission" (Matthew 28:19-20), which command his disciples to "go". It's difficult to ignore the call of Christ for his followers to take the initiative. Rather than waiting for "them" to come to us, we are being sent to "them". There is no "Field of Dreams" theology ("If you build it, they will come") in the New Testament.

Who will you invite to Easter worship? For whom are you praying in the weeks leading up to Easter? To whom are you reaching out "to engage with the love of Christ?"

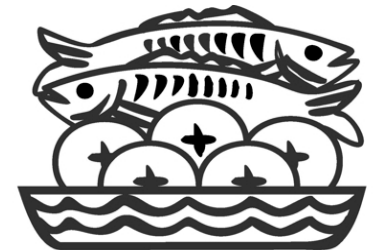
