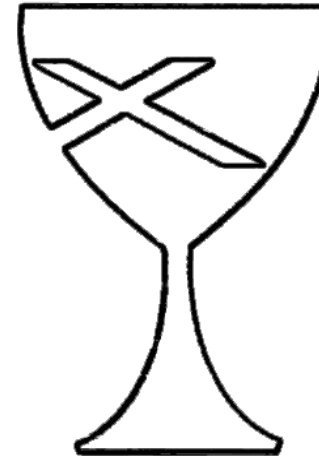

*Sent With Love To You!*



I'm told preachers shouldn't meddle in politics. I agree; therefore, my politics are pretty simple. I vote consistently along one party line; but all the parties disappoint me more frequently than not.

Far too many folks appear to believe they already have all the truth, and anybody who disagrees is wrong, and must be corrected. Far too often the attempts at correction are hostile and filled with the language of hate (although hatred is universally denied).

(Pardon me while I polish my halo a bit.) I think I'm a good listener, and intend to listen to all perspectives on any given issue. I truthfully can say that, as a result, I often change—or at least modify—my perspectives regarding a given issue.

That doesn't mean I'm "wishy-washy". Until I am persuaded otherwise, I hold strong convictions about most subjects. On the other hand (hold on a second while I adjust my halo), I recognize the difference between "conviction" and "truth." I've quoted Richard Hamm often (including last Sunday's sermon), "I believe in absolute truth, but I don't believe any human or human group is capable of perceiving truth absolutely."

Nevertheless, I feel compelled to keep on trying to articulate my own convictions, perhaps as much for self-understanding as for communicating them to others. So, I'll keep trying, in the hope that I'll be either heard or corrected. Either result is acceptable.

My political position is simple: it's about people—all people—having unencumbered access to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness—and all things implied by those words. I believe our government exists to fulfill the intent of the Preamble to our Constitution: "...to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence<sup>1</sup>, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity..." That's pretty much my politics.

Far too often the details of implementation get lost in the quagmire of partisan ideologies from both the right and the left. Those ideologies too often become smoke screens to hide the intention of *not* reaching out to people. Some of those ideologies manifest a callous lack of caring. Others assume most (or all) recipients are undeserving. Some ideologies assume government should not be involved in anything other than infrastructure and national defense (Constitutional Preamble notwithstanding); and some would put budgets and spending above the needs of people.

Many who oppose public assistance would defer that task to faith-based and private sector entities. Theoretically, I agree. Tragically, human need exceeds the resources of faith-based entities, most of which are declining and struggling to survive. Many private foundations and individual philanthropists deserve praise; but their combined resources still are insufficient; therefore, of necessity they must designate which human needs their donations touch, thereby bypassing other significant needs.

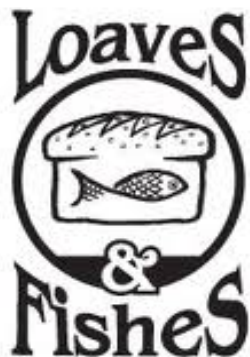
