#### **His Love Endures Forever**

I was purchasing a few items from a local retailer yesterday when I noticed that the young woman behind the counter had a tattoo on the inside of her right arm. In cursive lettering it simply said, "The secret to change..." I couldn't help myself so I asked, "So what is the secret to change?" Without saying a word, she showed me the inside of her other arm, which also bore a tattoo. This one said, "...letting go of fear." We had a very brief, but meaningful conversation and I left the store thinking about how powerful and how profoundly true those words really are.

One of the few things that many psychologists and theologians agree on is this: every human feeling ultimately comes from one of two fundamental emotions - love or fear. The first is positive and constructive and the second is negative and destructive. I don't think it is a coincidence that these are the two primary forces that contend with each other in the spiritual realm as well. Scripture says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear... and whoever fears has not been perfected in love." (1 John 4:18)

A saying you will hear me come back to frequently is, "Any area of my life that is causing me anxiety (or fear) is an area I am trying to control (or haven't entrusted to God yet)." When we try to run the show (in our own lives, at work, at church, in our families, etc.) it generates fear and fear brings out the worst in us. On the contrary, when we learn to "let go and let God," things work out better and we feel better on the inside as well.

As much as we love and try to trust God, change can still be frightening and uncomfortable. I remember moving out of my old house a few years ago. I knew that the new house was better than the old one in at least a hundred ways, but it was still scary. I chose to follow where I believed God was leading my family, however, and I and now I am so thankful I did!

It might seem like a lot of things are changing at our church right now (loud new songs in first service, ministers without neckties in second service, things being moved around a bit, and a complete renovation of the annex right around the corner) and it can be a little unsettling. But we are also growing. In fact, our average attendance on Sunday mornings has increased by twenty-five people in the last eleven weeks (about 15%) compared to what is was the first five months of 2016. Numerical growth is exciting, but what is even more exciting are the people and the families whose lives we see growing deeper and richer in the process.

Lot's of churches want to grow (physically and spiritually), but want to do it with without adapting or changing anything. I am thankful that the members of our church are putting faith into action and I believe we are already seeing God's blessing as a result. One thing that is helpful for me during times of transition is to remember that our fundamentals always stay the same. We are a community that was founded on grace and is sustained by God's love. And as we continue to cast aside our fears and grow in our love for God and one another good things will continue to happen.

This journey can be a little scary at times, but I can honestly say there is no one else on this earth I would rather be sharing it with than all of you. Thank you again for being so wonderful and for being so brave.

- » \$50 each for first-time participants.


In addition, if you are under 50 years old, and are one of the first 10 men under 50 to register, your fee will be refunded to you after the event. Registration forms are available at the church office.
